FROM THE EDITOR’S DESK

Last summer Theron Rumsey, our Chapter President, issued impassioned appeals for members to step forward and assume leadership positions in our chapter. In the July 2010 newsletter he said “Your chapter needs your help for it to continue as the chapter we know”. His bottom line was that our help is important, needed and essential for our chapter to continue. **Not one person stepped forward to be our chapter president so Theron continued as Chapter President through 2011.** He also took on the tasks that would normally be performed by the 2nd Vice President.

In our September 2010 newsletter I noted that there are about 65,000 Federal Retirees in North Carolina and approximately 6500 are members in the North Carolina Federation of NARFE Chapter and 650 members that regularly attend meetings of the Federations 51 chapters. Our Chapter currently has 370 members and much less than 10 percent attend chapter meetings on a regular basis and none of these seem willing to volunteer for available leadership positions.

At our July 2011 chapter meeting Bruce Habermann, Ted Mathis and I were elected to serve on the nominating committee for 2012 officers. **If our Chapter is to continue after this year, it is essential that we identify members that are willing to serve as President, 2nd Vice President and Secretary of our chapter.** To date, we have had no success and I am not willing to pressure members to assume leadership positions in an organization where so few are willing to be active. Remember, in North Carolina about one percent of Federal Retirees are active in NARFE chapters and few of these seem willing to take on leadership positions. Unless, we get volunteers for our upcoming leadership positions, I am recommending to the Chapter Executive Committee that our December 2011 Chapter meeting be devoted to recognition of those that are currently serving as Chapter officers and those that have served in the past and that we recommend to our Federation and National officers that the Chapter be closed.
