Committee Reports: Legislative: Paul Sams reported his attempts to obtain status about legislation related to retirement benefits with both Howard Coble's office and NARFE National. He also urged the membership to contact the office of House Speaker Nancy Pelosi regarding H.R. 82 (GPO – Government Pension Offset and WEP Windfall Elimination Provision); **Membership: Vilma Geisert**. Peter Feeney, Glenn Lazarus and George Sandoval will assume responsibility for the recruitment of new members. George LeVander received contact about free TV/radio time available for NARFE announcements. President Geisert turned over the contact information to George Sandoval, Public Relations. **Programs: Peter Feeney** contacted the manager of the local H&R Block Income Tax Service to speak at the February 12th chapter meeting. Peter will undergo surgery this month and during his recuperation period, Vilma Geisert will assume temporary responsibility. She asked the membership for suggestions regarding future programs. **Service Officer: Clarence Martin:** No report. **Alzheimer's Research Raffle:** Julina LeVander; today's raffle netted \$55.00; **Telephone Tree:** Ed Klingenschmidt: Absent; **Sunshine Program:** Louise Klabbatz; no new activity to report; **Public Relations:** George Sandoval. Legislative News: Senator John Warner(R-VA) introduced Premium conversion legislation, S 773 on March 6th. Sen. Warner is joined by fellow Virginia Senator Jim Webb as the featured cosponsor in this year's effort to allow civilian and military retirees to pay health insurance premiums on a pre-tax basis. Five Senators are "original" cosponsors: John d Rockefeller IV (D WV), Olympia Snowe (R ME), Susan Collins (R ME), Trent Lott (R MS) and John Sununu (R NH). Rockefeller, Snowe and Lott are members of the Senate finance Committee which has jurisdiction for tax legislation. This might finally get the bill out of the committee, we can at least hope for something this year. On February 16th, Rep Tom Davis introduced Premium Conversion legislation, HR 1110 in the house 19 out of 28 "original" cosponsors serve on the House Committee on Ways and Means, this might get the bill out of committee in the house. Our own Howard Coble (Congressman for Moore County) was one of the first to co sponsor this bill with Rep. Davis.

Sandhills Chapter 1895 News

February 12th meeting recap: Sandhills Chapter of NARFE had its regularly scheduled monthly meeting at the Community Congregational Church at 141 N. Bennett St. Southern Pines, NC. President Lloyd Geisert opened the meeting with the invocation by Leatrice Beasley followed by the Pledge of Allegiance. Twenty members were in attendance.

Ms. Jerry Overton from H&R Block in Pinehurst addressed the membership about income tax filing issues and took questions from the floor. She emphasized H&R Block has 5 other offices in the area and, in addition to corporate tax preparation, prepares investment, retirement and short form W-2 simple returns. She explained the telephone tax credit, which applies to long distance telephone federal tax. At Paul Sam's request, she also addressed the Bailey Settlement, which relieves federal annuitants from paying NC state tax.

Legislative: Paul Sams reported that chapters that receive checks by direct deposit would be posted to their bank accounts on February 13, 2007. He read the statement from the NARFE President Baptiste's regarding the FY08 budget plan submitted by President Bush, in which she praised improvements in retirement claims processing but criticized the Administration's renewal of the Health Savings Accounts (HAS) option in the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program (FEHBP). The opposition is based on the NARFE position that these plans could increase costs to the government as well as disaggregate the risk pool by attracting younger and higher income enrollees. Sponsors of NARFE-supported legislation to repeal the Social Security Government Pension Offset (GPO) and Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) have added co-sponsors bringing the House to 182 and the Senate to 9. Paul also reported on the status of HB1267 in the NC State Legislature, which is an extension of the Bailey Settlement Act for employees hired after 8/13/84. **Continued page 4**

He also was in contact with Fred Vega, Cary Postal Carrier Union Representative; Mr. Vega agreed to request the board that a representative from NARFE Chapter 1895 address his group on the benefits of NARFE. Paul Sams will represent our chapter. Mr. Feeney is coordinating the arrangements. **Service Officer:** Clarence Martin: No report. **Alzheimer's Research Raffle:** Julina LeVander; today's raffle netted \$52.00. 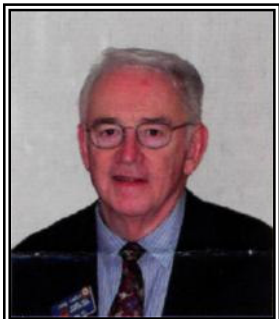

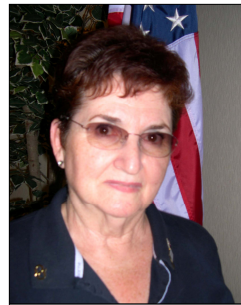

Recruitment & Retention:
